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This is repeated 40 times, and the proportion of correct responses is recorded. Because there are 5 cards, we expect random guesses to be right 20% of the time (1 out of 5) in the long run. So in 40 tries, 8 correct guesses, a proportion of 0.20, is common. But of course there will be variability even when someone is just guessing.
