Because of this danger, the U.S. Congress passed the Federal Employers' Liability Act (FELA) in 1908. For over 100 years, the FELA has provided the only legal remedy for railroad workers injured or killed while in the service of the railroad. Railroad employees are not eligible for state workers' compensation benefits.

Under FELA, railroad workers and their families became entitled to sue the railroad companies for compensation.

Enacted in 1906, the Federal Employers Liability Act was one of the first mandates on employment law passed by the United States Congress. The goal of the act was to provide compensation to railroad employees in the event of injury as well as protect railroaders from general misconduct and negligence by the companies for which they worked.
